

## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

This redesigned annual report card issued by the Oregon Department of Education offers a comprehensive picture of what Siuslaw Elementary School offers. At the time of this report, we do not yet have scores delineating an overall rating for our school

When compared to other schools in our state, our 4th grade students are performing at or above the state average in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Our 5th grade students continue to outpace the state average in Science.

There are significant gaps between Siuslaw students and the state average among our 5th grade students in English Language Arts and Mathematics. To address these gaps, Siuslaw Elementary has expanded our options for Reading and Math

interventions, given more scheduled time in priority subjects and enhanced our offerings for teacher professional development. While most of our students are performing at "Level 3", some of our sub groups have failed to make adequate growth. We will continue to monitor the growth of students in minority groups throughout the school year.

Parents and families can help by monitoring your student's homework, attending parent-teacher conferences, or volunteering as classroom support. We look forward to partnering with you over the coming year to make sure all of our students reach their fullest potential.

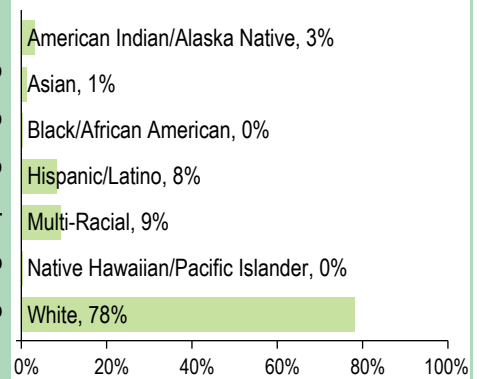

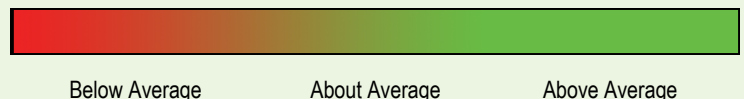
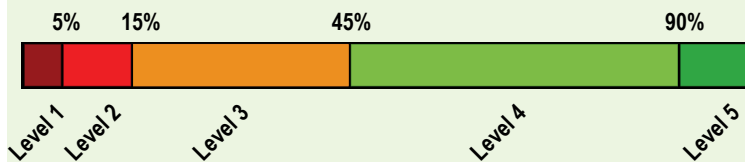
